- Winner of the Colonial Conference All-Sports Award, given to the one school in the conference with the best win-loss record each year for all sports. HMHS has won this award every year since its inception in 1978.
- The HMHS Athletic Program was ranked #8 in the 2018-2019 MaxPreps Cup National rankings. HMHS was also ranked #8 during the 2017-2018 school year. HMHS was the only high school in New Jersey in the top 10.

# Accelerated and Advanced Placement Offerings


- Haddonfield Memorial High School is proud to offer 18 accelerated courses and 24 Advanced Placement courses. Our students score above the national average in each department.
