Our Mission

The mission of the Haddonfield Public Schools, working in partnership with families and the community, is to develop the unique potential of each individual by creating a challenging and diverse learning climate that promotes the development of the whole student and prepares students with the knowledge and skills to meet life's challenges and enrich their community.

- Grades 9-12, enrollment 825, senior class 189
- Fully accredited by the New Jersey Department of Education
- Students strive for excellence in a rigorous college-preparatory program with 165 curricular offerings
- Shared commitment of students, faculty, and parents to academic and personal growth
- The tradition of excellence dates from 1809
- Offers Concentration of Studies program that facilitates mentorships associated with a planned course of studies
- One of the few public schools to attract non-resident students
- Nearly 94.5 percent of the Class of 2025 continued their education at the postsecondary level

Community

- Located in Camden County, New Jersey, seven miles east of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania
- Suburban Residential - Population of 12,000+
- The population is comprised of business leaders, executives, and other professionals with an above-average socioeconomic level
- Comprised of single-family homes with little in the way of industry

Student Involvement

- **Athletics:** 28 athletic programs with 53 total teams; 85% of students participate
- **Extracurricular Programs:** 65 different clubs and activities; 40% of students take part in music and drama, while 85% are involved in extracurricular programs
- **Service to Others:** National Honor Society, Peer Leadership, Peer Mentors, and Peer Tutors as well as a number of clubs enable students to develop leadership skills while providing support to others

- In 2025, Niche.com ranked HMHS #10 in the state and #195 in the nation
- In 2025, *US News and World Report* ranked Haddonfield Memorial High School #31 in the state and #531 in the nation
- *Philadelphia Magazine* cited HMHS as one of the finest schools in the Philadelphia Region on multiple occasions
- In 2025, *The College Board* provided Haddonfield Memorial High School with the distinction of AP Honor Roll - Gold.
- 65% of students in the Class of 2025 took an AP exam in their senior year.
- 91.52% of students in HMHS scored 3+ on at least one AP exam.

Recognition - Athletics

- NJ.com consistently ranks HMHS teams in their Top 20 varsity sports rankings
- 18-time winner of the ShopRite Cup, awarded to the school having the highest overall achievement among all Group II athletic programs in New Jersey.
- Winner of the Colonial Conference All-Sports Award, given to the one school in the conference with the best win-loss record each year for all sports. HMHS has won this award every year since its inception in 1978.

Accelerated and Advanced Placement Offerings

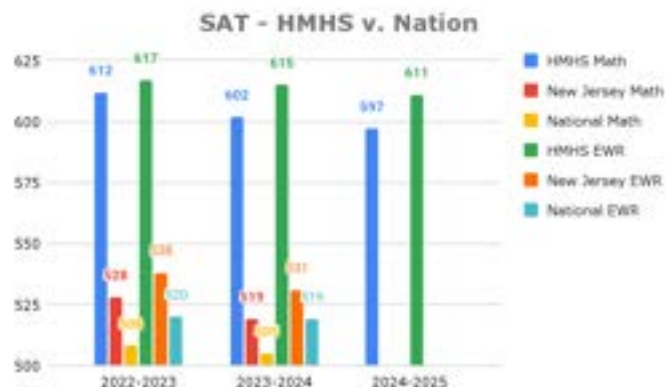
- Haddonfield Memorial High School proudly offers 21 accelerated courses and 25 Advanced Placement courses. Our students score above the national average in each department.
- *Multivariable Calculus and Advanced Computer Science Applications are more rigorous than an accelerated course and are weighted the same as an AP course.*

CONVERTING GPA TO A 4-POINT SCALE
